



Meet the Candidates

Fred Gregory worked as a chemical engineer for the past 40+ years. He retired from his current position as Process Safety Manager and Technical Fellow at Lubrizol's Deer Park facility at the end of 2024. Fred is looking forward to having more time to devote to hobbies such as playing bridge at the local club and at tournaments. He says, "It has been a challenge to balance work with my bridge life!"

Fred started playing bridge at age six with his grandparents and parents using the traditional Goren methods. His parents had the same group of friends playing bridge at each others' homes for over fifty years. Fred took a bridge hiatus when he got married and had children (three) but picked it back up in 2015 when his son suggested he try it once again.

Since resuming the game, Fred plays regularly at the Bridge Club of Houston. He hasn't missed a single Lone Star Regional and has attended almost all the local sectional tournments as well. His favorite bridge partner is his wife, Shawn, who has won several world championships and over 20 national championships. 



A Fun Squeeze from Toronto's Summer NABC

[Editor's Note: This article was published in the December 1 Daily Bulletin of the recent NABC in Las Vegas.]

My partner and I had this hand in the third session of the Von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs at the recent Summer NABC in Toronto (July 20). It features a guard squeeze, where East has potential winners in two suits (here, hearts and spades), but also can't afford to throw a baby club, since the low club guards the queen and protects West against a simple club finesse.

As it played out, this squeeze turned out to be almost automatic, which surprised me. I didn't have to do more than take a heart finesse and give up a trick early to rectify the count (squeeze talk for "get into a position where I had all but one of the remaining tricks"). Watch as I replay the hand (Note: I've rotated the hand 180 here to make it easier to follow; the South hand in the diagram was originally dealt to North, and so on around the table)



When RHO bid 1 \clubsuit , I gave up on Great Things settled for the 3NT that I expected to make. West led the \clubsuit 9 as you'd expect, and I covered with the \clubsuit Q, East played \clubsuit King, and I won the \clubsuit A.

Trick 2: I led the ♦ King and all followed suit.

Trick 3: I led the ◆9 to the ◆A and was happy to see the suit split 2-2. Note that I have kept the diamond four in my hand; should I need an entry to dummy, I can lead the ◆4 to dummy's ◆5! It's good practice to pay attention to spots at this level of detail and keep entries wherever possible. Trick 4: I led the ♥Q which was ducked all around. Now I stopped to take stock. At this point I have four tricks in the bag. I have these sure tricks to come: ♠J, ♥A, three diamonds, and two top clubs... that's four plus seven, eleven. There aren't any legit chances for a finesse for a 12th trick, but I might be able to find a squeeze if the cards lie right. As a general rule, for a squeeze to work, you need to have all but one of the remaining tricks, here I have 11 of 13, or all but two.


Trick 5: Since I have stoppers in all the suits, I can afford to give up a spade trick, so I led the \bigstar 5, East played the \bigstar 8, and I ducked to "rectify the count". Now I've got all but one of the last tricks:



With eight cards in the diagram above, it's a bit complicated, but let's break it down by suit:

I have the good AJ. East can't lead a spade because I'll take the finesse and claim (My AJ7 sits over East's AT6). East must keep two spades to keep my A7 from becoming a winner.

I have the ♥A which will soon be played, establishing East's ♥K as a winner and my ♥J in dummy as a threat card. Clearly, East must keep his ♥King. I have the ♣AK. The ♣10 is a threat, but I can't come to three club tricks on my own – if I try to finesse, West will win the ♣J or East will win the ♣Q. East's ♣Q isn't a winner on its own, though, as it will fall under the ♣A and ♣K if I cash them. East's problem is that if ♣5 is pitches, the ♣Q falls under the ♣A, and his partner's ♣J can now be finessed when I lead toward the ♣KT





I called this a nearly automatic squeeze because I didn't have to do anything exceptional other than rectify the count. That is, give up a trick early to make sure I had all but one of the remaining tricks and pay attention to East's cards so I knew it had to have two spades and the $\mathbf{\Psi}$ K as the last three cards. Note: There are other paths to 12 tricks on this hand after West leads his \mathbf{A} 9, but

I'm happy to have found this line at the table.

Off Shape Double Leads to Trouble



Takeout Double: General definition is that one has shortness in opener's suit, other major(s) and tolerance for the fourth suit. Doubler also promises an opening hand and maybe less, if the hand is shapelier.

Off Shape Double: The doubler has three or more cards in opener's suit and has no more than an opening hand.

Redouble: After Right Hand Opponent doubles partner's opening bid, a redouble promises 10+ HCPs and many play that it also implies no fit for partner's suit. This redouble alerts opener that we have more points than the opponents and we should try to double anything that they bid. If neither of us can double, we need to bid something to at least 2NT.

Penalty Double: The opponents are in trouble The following hand is an example of an Off Shape Double, a Redouble and a Penalty double.





The bidding is: West North East South 1♦ DBL RDBL Pass Pass 1♠ DBL Pass Pass

East makes an Off Shape Double. South has the requisite number of HCP for game. However, South is in no hurry and decides to redouble. West and North both pass. East is in a conundrum. If North makes overtricks playing 1 doubled and redoubled, East/West will get a bad score. For better or worse, East decides to bid 1 . South doubles. This double is a Penalty Double. When the dust clears, East is down 3 for -800. North/South is cold for 3NT (400) plus any overtricks.

Summary

Try not to make Off Shape Doubles, even if you have an opening hand. If partner has 9+ HCP they will balance with a TakeOut Double or bid their suit. An expert gave me great advice, if you have nothing to say, Pass.
